What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Residential Burglary reports: (Just four reports made across both Wards last month)

7/4/23 Goths Lane, theft of medication from hallway of property following delivery by the local chemist 11/4/23 Railway Street, at least 3 males have been seen trying garage doors within the neighbourhood and stealing push bikes from at least one garage

11/4/23 New Walkergate, attempt entry to garage with negative results

21/4/23 Shepherds Lea, purse and contents stolen from property, suspect arrested and charged for the offence

Business Burglary reports: (just four reports made across both Wards last month)



17/4/23 Millets Butcher Row, two males on one motorbike were seen driving towards the store, and have then used force to break into the store smashing a front panel in the process

19/4/23 Toll Gavel Church, money has been stolen overnight and a window at the back of the church broken in the process of gaining entry

19/4/23 Lairgate, theft of a 50-litre drum of oil waste has been stolen from premises, named suspect and enquiries continue

23/4/23 Beckside, theft from business premises – computer software and cash stolen

5/4/23 Flemingate Centre, damage caused to street signs/furniture, suspect named and enquiries ongoing

7/4/23 Minster Avenue, a group of 8 youths are seen to enter victim's driveway and rip the number plate off the front of vehicle before running off with it

9//23 Wykeland Group, Flemingate, damage caused to planters and shrubs

11/4/23 The Potting Shed, damage caused to rear shed

13/4/23 Cherry Tree Lane, damage caused to front door of property

15/4/23 Sigston Road, damage caused to vehicle

16/4/23 Woodlands, adult male arrested and charged for causing damage to property window

16/4/23 Deer Park Way Play Area, park bin has deliberately been set on fire

19/4/23 Goths Lane, adult female is arrested and charged for domestic related criminal damage to property

24/4/23 Grovehill Road, damage caused to vehicle

25/4/23 St Andrew Street, damage caused to vehicle – windscreen and bonnet

Other: Over forty other investigations across all Wards last month, ranging from malicious communications, public order, stalking and harassment incidents to name just a few.

2. Community Priorities for May 2023

Humbertalking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

. Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life in the community

In the last 3 months there have been 26 calls for service to this area. This is a drop by 11 calls since last month. 17 of these incidents were youth related. There were 9 public order offences and 6 violence/assault logs.

Tackling Anti-social behaviour and offending at Flemingate. Neighbourhood Policing Teams will continue to patrol the area on foot, specifically in afternoons and evenings when we generally get the most calls for service. When suspects have been identified, proportionate action is being



taken to hold them to account while also diverting them away from causing further issues. In order to reduce this further we need residents to continue to report incidents and provide the identity of those responsible if possible.

We will continue to monitor and patrol the area and access the impact.

We would also encourage the community to report any issues by calling Humberside Police on 101 (non-emergency number) or CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111.

High Visibility Presence in local shops.

We still have an increase in shop thefts so we will be conducting more high visibility through the coming weeks.

Preventing Theft

We are aware of concerns regarding Thefts in the ward area.

Action taken:

We have been working hard to provide support and guidance to prevent further offences, whilst completing enquiries to identify and tackle those responsible.

We will be completing regular patrols in the areas of concern.
