### What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?



**HUMBERSIDE POLICE turn 50 in April** 



#### Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Improve Road Safety
- 2. Reduce ASB improve the quality of life.
- 3. Tackle Rural Crime

Here's a summary of **just some** of the crimes that have been reported across both Wards last month:

#### **Residential Burglary reports (five investigations)**

10/1/24 -Orchard Garth, shed burglary to property after suspects break the lock to the shed but are then disturbed by owner and run off by climbing the fence.

18/1/24 – Grayburn Lane, patrol come across a single vehicle accident and sights 3 x males making of from said vehicle wearing balaclavas, 2 x males are detained a short time later hiding in gardens and a bag containing tools are found in suspects possession. Officers attend registered keepers home address to find their garage is insecure. Suspects arrested with bail conditions and enquiries ongoing.

18/1/24 – Central Avenue, attempt residential burglary by 4 unknown persons that are disturbed by owners' dog and make off from the address. Suspects caught on ring doorbell CCTV and are subsequently arrested with police bail conditions.

21/1/24 – Wellington Road, unknown suspects approach the rear of victim's property and gain entry by smashing the glass in the rear patio doors, before entering and conducting a messy search taking various high value items including jewellery and computer tablet.



22/1/24 – Trinity Court, entry gained to property via an unsecure front door, enter living room and take I phone and two handbags before making off on a pedal cycle.

#### **Business Burglary reports (four investigations)**

14/1/24 – Hugh Rice Jewellers, Saturday Market, confirmed break in after an alarm activation. This is the second break in over the last 2 months and enquiries are underway.

19/1/24 – Woodmansey Mile, business burglary to building site after suspects approach site and push double clip fence through the enter and then approach steel container lift shutter up and put window through, once inside steal a variety of tools totalling around 300K and flee scene.

23/1/24 – Toll Gavel United Church, unknown suspects have scaled a gate to gain access to church grounds, smashing a bathroom window to enter before an untidy search was commenced and petty cash was stolen.

25/1/24 – Goods vehicle Testing Centre, suspects approach the gates to the premises and damage to break into yard with negative results.

#### Theft (eight investigations)

1/4/24 – Saturday Market, suspect takes keys from female's handbag to vehicle and then takes vehicle from nearby car park.

3/1/24 – Grovehill Road, theft of motorbike after suspects approach victim's bike which is at the back of the property with a steering lock on and make off from the scene.

3/1/24 – Tesco, Morton Lane, shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.



4/1/24 – Beverley Bus Station, unattended bus is entered via emergency exit door and items belonging to the driver are stolen from within.

5/1/24 – Dunelm, shop theft

8/1/24 – Butcher Row, theft from vehicle and disability badge stolen from within

9/1/24 – Morrisons Petrol Station, make off without payment of fuel.

9/1/24 - Millets, Butcher Row, shop theft, one adult male charged for offence.

#### Damage (three investigations)

2/1/24 – Eastgate, criminal damage to vehicle after unknown suspect approaches victim's vehicle and pushes thumb tack in tyre before making off.

16/1/24 – Long Lane, two young males enter an unlocked vehicle and break of the steering lock before being confronted by the owner. Suspect arrested and enquiries continue.

24/1/24 – Minster Moorgate, criminal damage caused to vehicle – side window.

#### Drugs (no new reports)

**Other** (over several other investigations) These include harassment, assault, public order, stalking, malicious communications, and blackmail to name just a few.



Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

#### 1. Improving Road Safety

You've no idea what's around the corner so slow down and give yourself time to react. Be ready to meet cyclists and slow-moving vehicles when you least expect them on rural roads. If you're out for a country drive, look out for other road users. Don't forget to "LOOK, LOOK & LOOK AGAIN" for those on two wheels.

Remember to share the road and we ask drivers to look out for Walkers, Cyclists and Horse Riders – Give them plenty of room.



#### **ACTION**

As we leave winter and enter the spring months, members of the Beverley Policing Team will continue to be out and about policing our roads.

#### 2. Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life in the community

This period is always one of our busiest, you will see a clear police presence on patrol in and around your neighbourhood over this period.



#### Action

Our Policing Teams works with our key partners and the community to reduce anti-social behaviour and the anti-social use of motor vehicles. We provide proactive responses to reports of anti-social behaviour in our neighbourhood Area and are constantly reviewing our patrol strategy to address this. We are working hard with partners to address this and ensure our market towns and rural communities are a safe place to live and work.

#### 3. Tackling Rural Crime:

Rural crime is not limited to the farmyard. Serious and organised crime groups are often linked to rural and wildlife crime particularly in relation to theft of agricultural machinery and poaching like hare coursing. Our patrols are reminding farmers to review their security and to keep their properties/equipment safe. In relation to the security of Tractor GPS Receiver and Screens, please visit the Police website for crime prevention advice around MARK IT, REMOVE IT and LOCK IT.

**ACTION:** Operation GALILEO has restarted for the season. Throughout this year we have worked with volunteers on the Rural Watches across the whole of the East Riding to deter rural criminality. In addition, we will utilise all the available technology, crime prevention techniques and assistance from the Rural Crime Team to deter and detect crime.

#### How you can help

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in that area.
