What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Preventing Residential Burglary – *SHEDUCATION***
- 2. Anti-Social Behaviour**
- 3. Road Safety**

*Here's a summary of **just some** of the crimes that have been reported across both Wards last month:*

Residential Burglary reports (ten investigations across both Wards)

5/3/24 – Residential Burglary – Kilvin Drive, suspects have used a blow torch to access the property by burning the patio door lock. Victim has been disturbed by the noise resulting in the suspects making off, nothing stolen but damage caused in the process.

8/3/24 – Residential Burglary – Inglefield Close after suspect takes the lock, barrel and handle out of the rear door to the victim's property and then proceeds to enter the rear kitchen area searching through drawers using a flash torch which awakens the victim resulting in the suspect being disturbed and making off from the location. Nothing believed to be stolen and enquiries ongoing.

8/3/24 – Attempt Burglary – Sorrel Close, suspect enters rear garden of detached dwelling via neighbouring garden and attempts to force handle and lock of a UPVC door with negative results. Enquiries ongoing.

10/3/24 – Attempt Burglary – Hull Road Woodmansey, unknown suspects break chain off main gate to victims' property and then carefully drills out the lock of the barn attached to the main property and entering. Victim disturbs suspects before they can steal anything, and they ride off on bicycles.

10/3/24 – Garage Burglary – Old College Drive, suspect enters complainants garden by unlocking garden gate and by unknown means approaches and enters garage via unlocked door stealing electric bikes from within before making off.

11/3/24 – Residential Burglary – Sheldrake Way, whilst occupants asleep suspects gain entry by using a blow torch to snap the conservatory lock, once inside ground floor searched and personal items taken from within, enquiries ongoing.

11/3/24 – Hanoi Burglary – Sheldrake Way, suspect's have gained entry to victims dwelling via forcing the conservatory door, once inside conduct a tidy search, removing vehicle keys and then taking victim's BMW outside. Enquiries ongoing.

11/3/24 – Residential Burglary – The Leases, suspects have forced entry via the rear conservatory door but have not got past the French Double Doors which were secure at the time, and nothing has been taken.

17/3/24 – Residential Burglary – Wellington Road, suspects enter victims' property by unknown means and steals prescribed medication from within before making off. Enquiries ongoing.

20/3/24 – Garage Burglary – Burden Road, entry gained to garage damaging security lock and light in the process and stealing 2 x Hybrid Cycles from within.

Business Burglary reports (no new reports)

Theft (eleven investigations)

1/3/24 – Tesco, Morton Lane, shop theft, suspect named, and enquiries continue.

2/3/24 – Corporation Road, theft of pedal cycle

2/3/24 – Boyes, Wednesday Market, shop theft, suspect named, and enquiries continue.

4/3/24 – Watts Road, theft of stone lion statues from garden

4/3/24 – Sainsburys, Grovehill Road, shop theft, suspect named, and enquiries continue.

4/3/24 – Chestnut Avenue, theft from vehicle, number plates stolen from front and rear.

7/3/24 – Browns Way, theft of vehicle after suspects approach victim's vehicle which is parked on the drive. Suspect proceeds to take the vehicle and makes off from the scene. Enquiries ongoing.

7/3/24 – Superdrug, Flemingate, shop theft

7/3/24 – Bartoline Ltd, Suspect found in possession of a stolen motorcycle and is subsequently charged and arrested for the offence.

17/3/24 – Holland & Barrett, shop theft

22/3/24 – Superdrug, shop theft

Damage (four investigations)

2/3/24 – Coltman Avenue – criminal damage caused to window.

3/3/24 – Grovehill Road, criminal damage caused to police vehicle by headbutting. Adult male arrested and charged for the offence.

19/3/24 – Victoria Road, criminal damage caused to internet cable on outside wall of victim's property – cable has been cut.

23/3/24 – Cherry Tree Lane, criminal damage caused to front window – smashing the outer pane.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Preventing Residential Burglary – SHEDUCATION

At this time of year when spring arrives and the clocks go forward, Burglaries of sheds and garages usually start growing! The police together with Neighbourhood Watch Groups are asking for your help. The value of property in sheds and garages is more than people think. Thieves are targeting them for power tools, cycles, and sports equipment. Hand tools are stolen and used to break into homes.

Action

During this month members of our Policing Teams will continue be out and about providing residents with advice on home security.



Let's weed out these thieves by getting some sheducation!

Secure the access to your shed or garage by locking gates and using thorny bushes. Have you visibly marked the contents of your shed? Note of serial numbers, take photos.

External security lights which are activated by movement are a useful deterrent. Doors of sheds require attention. Use strong hasp/staples and close shackled padlocks.

Use coach bolts or non-return screws to secure door hinges.

Chain cycles, mowers, ladders, and tools to a strong anchorage point.

Alarms for sheds and garages are available for under £20 at most DIY stores.

Together we'll crack crime. Join a home watch scheme.

Exactly what insurance cover do you have? Check that your household policy covers you for theft from your garden and outbuildings.

2. Preventing Anti-Social Behaviour

Antisocial behaviour (ASB) is any conduct that has caused or is likely to cause harassment, alarm, or distress to any person. It comes in many forms of behaviour that provoke a range of responses, from mild annoyance to overwhelming fear and insecurity. Incidents may be isolated or within a pattern of behaviour, and ASB can have a devastating effect on the lives of people and their communities.

Depending on the nature of the behaviour, it can be dealt with by the police or the antisocial behaviour team at your local council.

Action

During this month members of the Beverley Policing Teams will continue to be out and about patrolling the community to deter anti-social behaviour along with reassuring the public.

3. Road Safety

As with most other areas, road safety is something in which we can improve upon within our community.

Action

With the return of all children to our primary schools after the Easter Holiday, the Community Teams will be conducting patrols around the schools making sure that the roads are safe for everyone especial for our young members outside the schools' gates.
