What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- **Preventing Theft**
- **Reduce ASB and Criminal damage.**

*Here's a summary of **just some** of the crimes that have been reported across both Wards last month:*

Residential Burglary reports (three reports made)

15/6/24 Queensgate, residential burglary to property after officers are called to the address following reports of 4 juvenile males breaking into a garage/outbuilding. Three males are detained and arrested on suspicion of burglary with enquiries ongoing.

20/6/24 Peter Ward Homes, unknown suspects have entered building site and caused damage to properties flue pipe and UPVC doors before exiting as per entry method.

27/6/24 Ashmole Walk, residential burglary after unknown person enters dwelling via the rear door and proceeds to use the kitchen to make food. Suspect named and enquiries underway.

Business Burglary reports (one report made)

9/6/24 Vape Butcher Row, suspects have attacked the window on the shop front several times before eventually making a hole in the glass large enough to stick an arm through. Items within the caged area/window display have been touched, moved and others taken.

Theft (fourteen reports made)

6/6/24 Toll Gavel, theft from person, theft of purse and contents from elderly victim, enquiries ongoing.

11/6/24 Asda Norwood, shop theft

14/6/24 Schofield Avenue, theft of medication from property. Suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.

14/6/24 Tesco Morton Lane, shop theft, suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.

15/6/24 Millets Butcher Row, shop theft, enquiries ongoing to try and identify suspect.

19/6/24 Waterside Filling Station, shop theft, suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.

20/6/24 One Stop Flemingate, shop theft x 3, suspects identified and enquiries ongoing.

21/6/24 Lidl, theft of electric scooter

23/6/24 Marks & Spencer Butcher Row, shop theft, suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.

24/6/24 Flemingate Theft of pedal cycle, enquiries underway

27/6/24 Islay Bloom Dyer Lane, shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

29/6/24 Toll Gavel, theft from person of another, purse stolen from victim's handbag.

Damage (three reports made)

12/6/24 Warton Avenue, domestic related criminal damage to property, adult male arrested and enquiries ongoing.

21/6/24 Flemingate Centre, criminal damage caused by 3 suspects who attended the shopping centre and caused damage to the pay machine doors by kicking the door and causing the lock to come out before making off from the scene. Suspect identified and enquiries continue.

22/6/24 Mill Lane, road rage criminal damage resulting in damage caused to driver's side door by kicking it causing a dint. Enquiries ongoing.

28/6/24 Lidl, Woodmansey, theft from person of another, mobile phone.

Drugs (one report)

19/6/24 Enfield Mews, whilst officers conducting a search at a property a small white bag of powder suspected to be cocaine is found. Named suspect and enquiries ongoing.

Other (over forty other investigations across both wards) These include harassment, assault, public order, stalking, malicious communications and blackmail to name just a few.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Preventing Theft*

We are aware of concerns regarding Thefts in the ward area.

Action - We have been working hard to provide support and guidance to prevent further offences, whilst completing enquiries to identify and tackle those responsible.

We will be completing regular patrols in the areas of concern.

- 1. Reduce ASB, Criminal damage.*

We regularly deploy high visibility patrols to our communities in response to reports of criminal damage, drug dealing and anti-social behaviour involving scrambler bikes and mopeds.

The local policing team have also had productive meetings with partners from East Riding Council, Parish Councils and Neighbourhood Watch groups to listen to community concerns.

We understand how distressing acts of mindless vandalism in our parks and green spaces can be and I want to reassure the community that we take a zero-tolerance approach to anti-social and criminal behaviour.

Our officers are also committed to eradicating the harm that the illegal and anti-social use of off-road bikes cause to the communities through our Operation Yellowfin.

Action - As we enter summer, members of our Policing Teams will conduct regular high-visibility patrols and partnership working is ongoing to make sure that Beverley is a green space for everyone to enjoy as we head into the summer months.

Rest assured, where we receive reports of anti-social and criminal behaviour, we will not hesitate to act. If you witness any such behaviour in your community, please let us know so we can respond, target patrols to the relevant areas and stop criminals in their tracks.
