## **Notice of a Residents' Meeting**

**to discuss concerns with regard to the current junction at Long Lane and Woodmansey Mile**

**The meeting will be held at Woodmansey Village Hall commencing at 6.30pm on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2024**

The Parish Council is continuing to support resident concerns that vehicles (including construction lorries) are ignoring the signage at the junction of Long Lane / Woodmansey Mile, and are turning into Long Lane. This has resulted in an increase in volumes of traffic, speeding and lack of consideration for pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders in what is a designated 'quiet road'.

The Parish Council has invited the following to listen to residents and Councillor concerns:

- The Constituency Manager representing our MP the Right Honourable Graham Stuart MP
- Representatives from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner
- The portfolio holder for ERYC Highways
- Humberside Police.

The purpose of this meeting is for residents of Long Lane to identify concerns, provide examples where possible and to suggest solutions to the concerns raised.

### **Standing Orders for the meeting**

The meeting will be chaired by the Parish Council Chair, Kerri Harold and the following points of order will be maintained during the meeting:

- Everyone is welcome to speak at the meeting, although only one person will be permitted to speak at one time - over-talking will not be permitted.
- Persons wishing to speak should do so by raising their hand and only speak when invited by the Chair to do so. If possible, speakers should stand to ensure all can hear what they have to say.
- In order to ensure as many people as possible are given the opportunity to speak, persons should be brief in the points they make and Cllrs respectfully ask that if a point has been made by another person, it is not continually repeated except where examples of incidents highlighting the issue are given. It will be suffice to simply say "I agree with the previous speaker"
- The Parish Council appreciates that there are strong feelings in this matter however, offensive and abusive comments will not be tolerated. The purpose of the meeting is to positively and constructively identify issues and table possible solutions and not to engage in 'mudslinging' or criticism of stakeholders
- Any persons breaching the above will be given a warning to decrease. If this is ignored the person will be asked to leave the meeting. If this is refused the Chair will look at options including temporarily suspending the meeting or cancelling it altogether.
