#### **Meet the team-**

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

## **Crimes of note**

### **Residential Burglary reports**

## **Community Priorities June 2025**

**Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:**

## **1. Speeding**

This is the No 1 complaint from Parish Councils to the police so this will continue to be a priority. Community speed watch is to be continued to be introduced at all Parish council meetings for those that are experiencing speeding issues. This will allow residents to become police trained volunteers monitoring vehicle speeds in their communities, with the aim of changing the behaviour of some road users who drive above the speed limit through small villages.

## **2. Water Safety – Tickton/Eske**

As the weather starts to get better, it is likely that we will start to see a rise in calls for service around Tickton Bridge and Eske nature reserve. Over the coming weeks and months water safety presentations will be delivered to schools explaining the dangers. Patrols will be increased around hot spot areas, and we will utilise social media to spread awareness.

## **3. School Parking issues – update**

You spoke – we listened, since reports of parents regularly parking on double yellows, single lines, blocking driveways, we have increased patrols on specific times. Most schools now have a policy in place where there is a member of staff on entrance at entering and leaving times obtaining registrations of vehicles committing the offences of NO STOPPING on specific lines. School will then contact neighbourhood policing who will obtain the registered keepers address and contact will be made by way of correspondence. By following this process, we will see how many vehicles are committing offences when police are not in attendance and how many continue to commit offense after receiving the warning letter

# Parish/Town News Release



OPERATION SNAP is a secure online platform that allows you to submit video evidence of driving offences that you or other members of the public have witnessed. Its purpose is to improve road safety and to prosecute those that place others at risk. The service has been produced with the support of the Department for Transport.

The online service allows us to effectively deal with the footage recorded by members of the public in a safe and secure way, whilst making the investigation process simple and straightforward. We have a determined and robust approach to policing the roads and we'll take every opportunity to make them safer for everyone.

This portal can only be used for driving offences, it is not for submitting footage of Road Traffic Collisions or public order offences and is not for reporting crime.

It's easy for people to engage in Operation Snap and processes have been designed to run smoothly. Operation Snap is not asking you to go out and detect offences for us, but we will deal with any you find.

Operation Snap has one desired outcome: making our roads safer.
