Meet the team-

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

Crimes of note

Residential Burglary reports

8/6/25 Well Lane, two unknown suspects have forced entry into an enclosed locked garage causing extensive damage to the garage door. Suspects have then stolen victims' motorcycle which has then later been found by police. Suspects named and enquiries ongoing.



Business Burglary reports

6/6/25 Beverley 24-hour Self Storage, storage container united damage and entry attempted with some items removed from within. Enquiries ongoing.

7/6/25 Lairgate, business burglary to hair salon after 2 suspects arrive on a moped, smash the salon window and take items from the display cabinet. Suspects named and enquiries ongoing.

9/6/25 Flemingate Centre, business burglary to retail premises whereby two motorcycles have been used to force entry into the store, stealing clothing from within. One adult male has been charged and arrested for the offence and a further two males have been arrested with police bail conditions whilst the enquiry continues.

<u>Theft</u>

9/6/25 Lakeland, shop theft after two females enters the store and attempt to steal several pots and pans. Suspects named and enquiries ongoing.

18/6/25 Norwood, theft of pedal cycle, enquiries ongoing

21/6/25 Beverley Services, shop theft, enquiries ongoing.

27/6/25 Hamilton Walk, theft of pedal cycle from rear of property, suspects known and enquiries ongoing.

28/6/25 Superdrug, shop theft of toiletries, enquiries ongoing.



Criminal Damage

18/6/25 Princess Way, criminal damage caused to property driveway and drain, suspect known and enquiries ongoing.

20/6/25 Shammy's Bar, suspect arrested for intentionally causing damage to window due to throwing an object at it. Enquiries ongoing.

22/6/25 HSBC, Saturday Market, known male suspect in drink and under the influence has caused damage to the window of bank with his fist causing it to crack. Enquiries ongoing.

26/6/25 Newbegin, criminal damage caused to front door of the property by unknown means, enquiries ongoing.

27/6/25 Toll Gavel, one adult male charged and arrested for criminal related arson after he is seen to approach doorway to a store and empty the rubbish which had been left out for collection onto the doorstep, suspect walks away and then comes back and ours something over the rubbish before setting it on fire and leaving the area on foot.

Community Priorities May 2025

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Reduce pedal cycle thefts



Pedal cycle thefts have increased with offences mainly taking place at retail sites including Tesco, Morton Lane, Asda Norwood and Flemingate shopping centre. Most of these offences have been closed due to insufficient evidence. One suspect has been identified and subsequently arrested. Bike marking events continue in Beverley and rural areas to increase security/target hardening along with providing security advice.

2. Drugs

There are still issues regarding drug dealing around Beverley. Throughout the coming weeks and months patrols will continue to gather intelligence and take proactive measures to tackle drug dealing.

3. Anti-social behaviour - ongoing

Over the coming weeks and months patrols will arrange school talks focussing on anti-social behaviour and its consequences in both primary and secondary schools, we see a rise in ASB around Beverley.

Op Coastline is back once again!

Whether you're planning a seaside stroll, enjoying a picnic by the shore, or visiting local attractions, our coastal towns and villages are filled with springtime activities. However, this busy season can also present opportunities for crime and antisocial behaviour.



To help keep communities safe, local neighbourhood policing teams, the Rural Task Force, and the Community Safety Unit will be out on high visibility patrols and engaging with those across the area. Our Roads Policing unit will be actively patrolling key routes, using both marked and unmarked vehicles, to tackle and deter crime and antisocial behaviour.





OPERATION SNAP is a secure online platform that allows you to submit video evidence of driving offences that you or other members of the public have witnessed. Its purpose is to improve road safety and to prosecute those that place others at risk. The service has been produced with the support of the Department for Transport.

The online service allows us to effectively deal with the footage recorded by members of the public in a safe and secure way, whilst making the investigation process simple and straightforward. We have a determined and robust approach to policing the roads and we'll take every opportunity to make them safer for everyone.

This portal can only be used for driving offences, it is not for submitting footage of Road Traffic Collisions or public order offences and is not for reporting crime.

It's easy for people to engage in Operation Snap and processes have been designed to run smoothly. Operation Snap is not asking you to go out and detect offences for us, but we will deal with any you find.

Operation Snap has one desired outcome: making our roads safer.
