Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.













What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?



New: Our Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) campaign, linked to the NPCC's Safer Streets Summer initiative to keep our communities safe and connected.

Humbertalking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Drugs
- 2. Reduce Burglaries
- 3. Humber Talking



Here's a summary of **just some** of the crimes that have been reported across both Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports

16/7/25 Burden Road, male suspect has entered the victim's 3rd floor flat unannounced to obtain items from the flat and has then been challenged by the victim resulting in the arrest of male. Enquiries still ongoing.

Business Burglary reports

1/7/25 Toll Gavel United Church, business burglary to church after unknown suspects have smashed a window to the fire door allowing entry. Once inside, steal cash from cash boxes before exiting as per entry method. No known witnesses or suspects and therefore incident closed pending any further intelligence coming forward.

4/7/25 Crown Works Lairgate, business burglary to several of victim's lock- up garages causing damage in the process. No known suspects or witnesses currently and therefore incident closed pending any further intelligence coming forward.

7/7/25 Oxfam Toll Gavel, business burglary to charity shop after access to the store via a side door is gained, an untidy search has been carried out upstairs and a bag of watches is believed to have been taken. Enquiries ongoing.



9/7/25 The Friary Youth Hostel, youth related business burglary to an unoccupied hostel after unknown suspects have entered via one of the adjacent doors, once inside, set of several fire extinguishers and caused damage to the kitchen/dining area before exiting. Enquiries ongoing.

15/7/25 Colonial House, attempt business burglary to office unit with negative results. Enquiries ongoing.

20/7/25 The Friary Youth Hostel, 3 youths' approach unattended youth hostel and smash the front ground floor window and gain entry within. Once inside cause damage. Suspects named and enquiries ongoing.

Theft

4/7/25 Butcher Row, theft of pedal cycle, enquiries ongoing.

5/7/25 H&M Flemingate, shop theft amounting to £200 worth of clothing. Enquiries ongoing.

11/7/25 Tesco Morton Lane, shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

18/7/25 Blackthorn Garth, theft in dwelling, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

23/7/25 Flemingate Centre, theft of pedal cycle, no witnesses and enquiries ongoing.

Criminal Damage

7/7/25 Watts Road, racially aggravated criminal damage caused to victim's window by suspect throwing stones and a metal chair. Suspect named and enquiries ongoing.



8/7/25 Tesco Morton Lane, youth related criminal damage to store products. Suspects known and enquiries ongoing.

15/7/25 Thompson Avenue, criminal damage caused to vehicle after unknown suspect has damaged and removed both wing mirrors from victim's vehicle. No known suspects currently and enquiries ongoing.

Drugs

9/7/25 Norwood Far Grove, one adult male charged and arrested for cultivation of cannabis. Enquiries ongoing.

10/7/25 Ashmole Walk, adult female cautioned for being in possession of class b drugs – cannabis. Enquiries ongoing.

14/7/25 Wellington Road, one adult male charged and arrested for drug related offences. Enquiries ongoing.

25/7/25 Goths Lane, named suspect wanted for drugs offences, enquiries ongoing.

26/7/25 Flemingate, named suspect in possession of drugs, enquiries ongoing.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Drugs - We continue to review and develop intelligence around drugs misuse and supply within Beverley and surrounding areas. We continue to work with licenced premises carrying out visits and incorporating the use of pub watch and banning notices to target individuals linked to drug misuse. For operational and data protection reasons we are unable to give specific details of locations / premises or persons that we are currently investigating. We have been working with other agencies to tackle individuals of concern



linked to drug misuse. We ask that you continue to report concerns around drug misuse / dealing at the time. You can report anonymously via 'CrimeStoppers' at https://crimestoppers-uk.org/

- 2. Reduce Burglaries There has been an increase in business burglaries in the area and so we shall increase our patrols and provide as much high visibility as possible over the coming weeks. Please report any suspicious activity. Crime reduction advice is available, please contact your local neighbourhood team if required.
- 3. HumberTalking Humber Talking is still being undertaken in Beverley and surrounding areas. We will be speaking with householders on their doorstep however if you would rather participate online and highlight any issues you think the Police should be dealing with, please visit the website. www.mycommunityalert.co.uk/humbertalking Your responses help us better understand our area and prioritise issues to be tackled.

Stay safe, stay water-wise!

The East Riding region, with its long stretch of coastline and large tidal river, is a beautiful yet potentially dangerous place to enjoy water activities. Whether you're visiting the sea, a lake, a river, it's important to be aware of water safety.

Water safety tips:

- Obey any warning and safety signs
- If you are going out on your own, let someone know where you are going and when you are coming back
- Look out for trip or slip hazards around water and stick to proper pathways
- Remember riverbanks and cliff edges may be unstable and give way

What to do if someone falls into deep water

If someone falls into deep water, the first thing to do is call 999 for help. Use the **What3Words app** to help emergency services find you. The app uses a unique three-word address to pinpoint your exact location, so help can reach you quickly.

Never enter the water to try to save someone.



Remember: Float to Live

If you find yourself struggling in the water, don't panic. It's natural to want to swim hard, but cold-water shock can make this dangerous. Instead, focus on Floating to Live.

- -Tilt your head back with your ears submerged to help you float. Relax and breathe normally.
- Spread your arms and legs to stay more stable. Don't worry if your legs sink a little we all float differently!
- Once you're breathing normally, call for help or swim to safety.

Do you know what your child is doing behind closed doors?



For the first time, Counter Terrorism Policing, MI5, and the National Crime Agency are jointly calling on parents and carers to support their children to be safer online during the summer break.

We are increasingly seeing children being routinely exposed to the most serious harmful online content.

This includes sexual violence, self-harm and suicide content, extreme gore, animal cruelty, indecent images of children, and terrorist content.

This bombardment of online harms can quickly become normalised. Worryingly, some of the children who come to our attention are completely desensitised to extreme and obscene content.
